380. Film Review Year 6 and under

A competition to review a film, up to 300 words for years 6 and under.

381. Film Review Years 7, 8 and 9

A competition to review a film, up to 600 words for years 7, 8 and 9.

The aim of this competition is to give an opportunity for young people to write in a new style and format i.e. the review can be written in the form of a blog/journal etc

INTOFILM will be preparing awards for the winners, which will include a workshop for the class of the winner or an individual prize.

382. Learners Medal Competition Year 10 and under 25 years old The medal is donated by – Flint Town Council

The aim of the competition is to reward an individual who has dedicated his/her time to learn Welsh and who takes pride in their Welshness. The Learners medal will be given to an individual who can show how he/she uses the language from day to day socially and in the school.

Who can compete?

The competition is open to any competitor who is a member of the Urdd and aged between year 10 and under 25 years old.

(The definition of 'learner' is noted in the General Rules on page 18 of the Syllabus)

How to compete?

A competition form can be obtained by downloading from our website urdd.cymru/eisteddfod. The competitor can be nominated by the Local Development Officer or by a Teacher or they can nominate them selves. The application can be sent electronically or written as a hard copy and should include a video presentation no longer than 2 minutes by the competitor. All forms and clips to be sent to the Eisteddfod Dept, Glan-llyn. On the form the following should be included:

- i. Information about family and interests
- ii. Reasons for learning Welsh
- iii. The effect learning Welsh has had on the life of the competitor and the use he/she makes of the language.
- iv. Hopes for the future

The form must be submitted by 1 March 2016 to Trefnwyr, Adran yr Eisteddfod, Gwersyll yr Urdd, Glan-llyn, Llanuwchllyn, Y Bala, Gwynedd. LL23 7ST or cyfansoddi@urdd.org by following the instructions.

The preliminary round will be held during the Easter holidays 2016 in one of the Urdd Centres where various tasks will be set by the Adjudicators to prove the ability of the competitor to communicate through the medium of Welsh.

Three competitors from the preliminary rounds will be chosen to come to the final which will be held on the Monday at the National Urdd Eisteddfod before deciding who will be worthy of the Learners Medal.
