Main duties and responsibilities:

- 3. Support activities during school holidays.
- 4. Create session plans to match the activities.
- 5. Collaborate with the department's staff and schools in order to encourage children and young people to take up Sports opportunities in their area.
- 6. Collaborate with volunteers and coaches within clubs and events.
- 7. Promote the use of the Welsh language within our services.
- 8. Support regional and national sporting events under the leadership of the events department.
