Urdd National Eisteddfod General Rules

The rules stated below are relevant to every Eisteddfod – Local, Regional and National.

What is an Eisteddfod?

The Urdd National Eisteddfod, one of Europe's largest youth touring festivals that attracts around 90,000 visitors each year, will once again be held during Whitsun week at the end of May.

The Eisteddfod is a competitive festival with over 15,000 children and young people under the age of 25 competing during the Eisteddfod week in various competitions such as singing, dancing and performing. They have been whittled down from around 40,000 competitors across Wales, having won their place following local and regional rounds held in the spring months leading up to the Eisteddfod.

The 1,800 seater Pavilion is the home of the competitions and is very much the hub of the Eisteddfod. Surrounding the Pavilion, on the 'Maes', you will find hundreds of colourful stalls offering a range of activities for all the family - from biking, climbing and sport sessions to a fun fair, live bands and children's shows with some well known TV characters. In a recent survey conducted by Beauford Research, 97% of the visitors agreed that it was a great family day out.

The Urdd Eisteddfod week is the pinnacle of around three years hard work by local volunteers. It attracts a lot of attention from the press including TV, radio and local and national newspapers.

The Urdd Eisteddfod is a touring festival and is held in a different location in Wales each year. In 2022 it will be held in Denbighshire, in 2023 it will be held in Llandoverly, Carmarthenshire and in 2024, the National Urdd Eisteddfod will visit Maldwyn.

We hope to see you there!

Eisteddfod yr Urdd Terminology

Region / Regional – County round

Organizer – Local Officer / Teacher / Volunteer

Group competitions – 5 members or more.

Person of care – Parents / Guardians / Branch leaders / Teachers / Instructors

Compliance with the Rules All competitors, coaches, parents, and supporters commit to complying with all Eisteddfod competition rules, general conditions and the Urdd's code of conduct. The Urdd guidance and Code of Conduct is available for all competitors, coaches, and parents to view by clicking www.urdd.cymru/en/about-and-policy-studies/confidentiality.

Official Names of Urdd Branches

1 School Adran (Adran Ysgol) - All branches operating within a Primary, Secondary, Lifelong or College School.

2 Adran / Aelwyd - A Community branch of the Urdd which is open to all members which conduct its meeting outside of school hours and a School arrangement with a program of activities throughout the year.

3 Performance / Specialist Branches - These Urdd branches are welcome to compete in the Eisteddfod in the relevant age categories, except for competitions restricted to Schools, Adran/Aelwyd. For further guidance, please contact the Eisteddfod Department.

4 Competing Outside Wales - Competitors who live beyond the Welsh border can compete in a designated Regional Eisteddfod. The normal registration procedure must be followed.

To be eligible to compete, all branches must register as an Urdd branch before their regional competition deadline. For more information, contact the aelodaeth@urdd.org.

Urdd Eisteddfod Language Policy

- 1 Welsh is the language of the Eisteddfod.
- 2 Background Music - Where it is noted that background music can be used, any instrumental music or be it in the Welsh language can be used, depending on copyright. See page 10 for more information

Who can compete?

- 1 **Members** - You must be a member of Urdd Gobaith Cymru to register to compete in the Denbighshire Urdd Eisteddfod. Membership is via our website: urdd.cymru/membership.
- 2 **Accessibility** - The Urdd Eisteddfod is committed to providing equal experience and opportunities for all, and to make every reasonable effort to make the competing experience as enjoyable as possible for all.
- 3 **Restrictions on Competition** - All members of the Urdd are entitled to compete in the local Area Eisteddfod if this is the member's wish.
- 4 **The Winner** - The winner will represent the Region at the Urdd National Eisteddfod. Where this is not possible, the Eisteddfod Department may invite the second at the Regional Eisteddfod to take their place. The Eisteddfod Department can invite the second as well as the first to represent the Region at the National Eisteddfod. The relevant competitors will be notified shortly after the last Regional Eisteddfod has been held. In the Region where the Eisteddfod is held, the first and second of each competition will be invited to represent the Region at the National Eisteddfod.
- 5 **Age for competing** - Competitors must be within the competition age on the 31 August after the 2022 Eisteddfod. For example, for a '14 and under 25' competition applicants must have turned 14, but not have turned 25. The date of birth of each competitor is requested before the Urdd National Eisteddfod. If there is doubt about the age of any competitor, the Eisteddfod Organisers will have the right to ask to see the member's birth certificate.

6 Competing

- i) All members of the Urdd can compete in the region where they live, where they receive their full-time education, or with the branch where they practice with the group competition in question.
- ii) All members must compete in individual Stage and Field competitions in the same branch. It will not be possible to compete in more than one Local / Regional round in individual competitions.
- iii) Each 19-25 yrs old duo, trio or quartet must compete where the majority of members live or receive their education. Where there is no majority, you must contact the Eisteddfod Department before registering.



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If under the age of 19, a member must compete in a branch where they live, where they receive their full-time education, or with the branch where they practice with the group competition in question.

iv) A member may belong to more than one branch – a School Adran and Aelwyd for example. That member can compete for either branch in different competitions. However, they must choose to compete as an individual in one branch or the other, but in group competitions the competitor can associate themselves with the branch that taught the group in that specific competition

v) Competitors are not permitted to compete for more than one branch in the same competition or belong to more than one group in the same competition.

7 Individual Member - Any Urdd Member is permitted to compete as an Individual Member when they are not affiliated to a branch in the Region where their home is, or where they receive their education.

8 Number in School Branches - In the competitions where the number of pupils in a school branch is limited, they should be counted from reception to Year 6 on 31 January. In Lifelong schools, count all relevant pupils up to year 6.

General Rules for Welsh Learners

1 Members where one parent in the home can speak Welsh should not compete as learners in individual competitions

2 Members moving to the English-medium education sector after a period in the Welsh-medium sector are allowed to compete as a learner in group competitions for learners only.

PRIMARY - Learners are classified as members who have not followed or are not following a Welsh programme of study in the Foundation Phase and in Key Stage 2. If they are latecomers, moving from a non-Welsh medium school to a school where the majority of pupils study through the medium of Welsh, they are permitted to compete as learners for their first three years at the school.

SECONDARY - Learners are members who have not followed / are not following a Welsh Programme of Study in Key Stages 2 or 3. If they are latecomers, moving from a non-Welsh medium Primary or Secondary school to a Secondary school where the majority of pupils study through the medium of Welsh, they are permitted to compete as learners for their first three years at the school.

3 Authenticity: When registering competitors leaders warrant the authenticity of every competitor in the Welsh Learners' Section competitions.

4 The General rules of the Urdd National Eisteddfod, in addition to the competition rules set out in each section also apply to learners' competitions.

How to Compete?

1 Register to compete - Everyone who wishes to compete must register on our website before their respective regional deadline. The deadlines can be found on our website: urdd.cymru/eisteddfod.

2 Verifying Period - There will be a verifying period of three working days for members to check the information post closing date. Guardians can check their children's competitions online, alerting the branch / school / Urdd of any problem.

3 Late Registration - Once the verifying period has expired the system will close and it will not be possible to add competitors or modify information unless an administration fee is paid. Late registration can be made by paying the administration fee up to 48 hours before the first performance

4 Syllabus Set pieces - Competitors must learn the work set out in the syllabus, noted alongside the competition, and be prepared to perform the whole work on a Local / Regional and National stage. No person is permitted to use copies of words and/or music in any manner, except in the instrumental section. Competitors must perform the correct key and edition noted in the Syllabus. Some competitions pieces offer a range of keys to choose from to suit the range of competitors, this will also be noted in the syllabus, next to the relevant competition.

5 Regional Eisteddfod - Each competitor must appear on the stage of the Regional Eisteddfod unless noted otherwise (page 75). No individual, party or choir may compete in the preliminary stages of the Urdd National Eisteddfod, unless they have been officially sent there following the result of a Regional Eisteddfod.

6 Consistency - Every competitor must perform/use the same piece(s) of work throughout the Eisteddfod journey, from the Local Eisteddfod to the Urdd National Eisteddfod. It is not permitted to change competitors between the Local, Regional and National Eisteddfod. Everyone in group competitions is encouraged to list reserves in order to avoid any problems which may arise.

Eisteddfod Rules

1 Joint winners - Joint placings (first, second and third) will not be awarded in any competition in the Local, Regional or National Eisteddfod. If joint winners' names are sent to the Eisteddfod Department, neither competitor will be accepted. In the same manner, it is not possible to share prizes in the Composition and Creating competitions.

2 Specific Time Rule - No performance may exceed the stated time specified in the Syllabus. If the competitor's performance is recorded over the allotted time in a Local and/or Regional Eisteddfod a note will be placed in the adjudication, and they will be verbally informed by the Eisteddfod organiser. The piece must be modified by the next performance.

By the National Eisteddfod, it is not permitted for any performance to be over the specified time limit. If the competitor is over time in the preliminary performance, they will not be able to go on to perform on the main stage. If a competitor is over time on-stage (but not in the preliminary) they will not be able to get first or second place

Note: The Urdd Eisteddfod's official timings will be used to decide if a competitor has gone over the permitted time.

3 Responding Before Competing - All competitors should be prepared to perform when called. If they do not register within half an hour of their performance time, the Eisteddfod Department has the right to remove them from the competition.

4 Official Accompanists - Vocal soloists and duets must use the Official Eisteddfod accompanists in the preliminary rounds and on-stage. This does not include instrumental soloists, the solo 19-25 years old, the solo from a musical or the duet/ensemble from a musical.



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Procedures and processes

1 The Adjudicator's Decision - The judges' decision in each case will be final within the rules and guidelines of the festival. Any appeal should be made in writing and brought to the attention of the Eisteddfod Organisers or Urdd Officers within an hour from the conclusion of any competition. The matter may also be discussed verbally. Under exceptional circumstances, an Appeal Panel will be established. There must be robust reasons for establishing an Appeal Panel. Disagreeing with the adjudicator's opinion is not an adequate reason. The main adjudicator of each competition is the name that appears first in the programme. The decision of the Chair of the Eisteddfod and Arts Board and the Chair of the Urdd will be final on the competitive matters of all Urdd Gobaith Cymru eisteddfodau.

2 Adjudication - A short adjudication will be available to all competitors after the competition has appeared on stage. A written adjudication cannot be promised to competitors for composition work. A list of the winners will be published on our website and app, as well as a volume of winning literary compositions and an exhibition of the winners in Art, Design and Technology Section. The adjudication will be provided in Welsh, but in exceptional circumstances it will be possible to provide a translation which will be available after the Eisteddfod.

3 Staging Competitors - If merited, three competitors will normally be allowed to perform on stage in each competition, but the number may vary based on the standard and stage timetable.

4 Adjudicators - Adjudicators are not permitted to instruct or teach any competitor within the sections in which they are adjudicating in the Eisteddfod between 1 September and the Eisteddfod.

Adjudicators of the Urdd National Eisteddfod should not adjudicate in County and Regional Eisteddfodau, in the same section in which they will adjudicate at the National.

The Director reserves the right to invite last-minute adjudicators so that the task can be performed at the County, Regional and National Eisteddfod.

5 Postponing of an Eisteddfod - The Urdd reserves the right to curtail, postpone or cancel any Local, Regional or National Eisteddfodau if it is deemed necessary due to exceptional circumstances. The Urdd will endeavour to ensure that all Festival arrangements are efficient but shall not be held accountable for any loss that may occur during any Eisteddfod in the Urdd's name.

6 Staging a Competition - The Urdd reserves the right not to stage all competitions on the main stage of the Urdd National Eisteddfod.

7 Public Performances - When submitting a registration form, the Person of care acknowledge that all the Urdd Eisteddfod activities are public and members will appear on stage in front of those who attend the event. The names of competitors and branches/schools will be announced from the stage in the Eisteddfod and in preliminaries. The names of competitors and branches/schools will be published on the Urdd's internal administration documents. At the Urdd National Eisteddfod, the names of competitors and names of the branches will be shared with the press including television and radio companies. There is a possibility that the names and images of Urdd Eisteddfod competitors will appear publicly on the Urdd website (e.g., Eisteddfod results) and other public platforms including but not limited to newspapers, local papers, other websites and on Urdd and other social media accounts. The Urdd National Eisteddfod will be broadcasted live on TV and radio and extensively from the Maes (see rule 9).

It is the person of care's responsibility to notify the Urdd of any reason not to disclose information about any member. The Urdd is willing to comply, collaborate and facilitate the process

to ensure that every member of the organisation can compete in the Urdd Eisteddfod in accordance with member's wishes.

8 Copyright - It is illegal to make additional copies of music, poetry, or any published work. For further details and guidance on how to secure performance consent please visit page ??.

The competitor is responsible for securing the right of the publishers to perform a piece of work in public, and for ensuring that any translation is an official translation registered and approved by the publisher. Proof is requested that these rights have been granted. It is the responsibility of the broadcaster to secure the right to broadcast a piece of work. The Urdd can provide an example of a letter to be sent to the publishers with suitable wording, as well as contact details of the various publishers. Failure to secure the right to perform may mean that competitor(s) are not entitled to perform in public at an Eisteddfod or Preliminary round. When using a copyright piece in an originally composed performance (e.g., Stand-up/Action Song etc), it is the competitor's responsibility to ensure all appropriate permissions to use the piece. Such permission must allow the Urdd, S4C and/or any third party to make the performance available without restrictions, globally, without royalties in all mediums or forms of distributions (which exist now or may be developed in the future). Copyright assistance is available by calling the Welsh Department, PRS for Music on 020 3741 4033 or emailing welshstvprogrammes@prsformusic.com. There is no need to ensure permission to use pieces in the Syllabus. We encourage everyone to choose songs that will not create any difficulty in terms of broadcasting. Some composers/groups should be avoided when it is not possible to secure copyright to broadcast the song. For further details and guidance on how to ensure permission to perform, go to page 10.

9 Broadcasting - When registering to compete or attend the Urdd Eisteddfod, the member or person of care acknowledges that there is a possibility that their picture or performance will be recorded and broadcast. The Urdd will be entitled to use them for the Urdd's purposes in the future including broadcasting on S4C, online, on our social media and on BBC Radio Cymru, without seeking the individual's further permission or payment of any other royalties or payment.

10 Publishing - The Urdd reserves the right to publish all or some of the winning Composing and Creating work to be used for Urdd purposes in future, without seeking further permission from authors or paying any royalties or any other payment.

11 Changes to the Syllabus - Any changes to the Syllabus will appear on the Urdd Eisteddfod website. If there are any differences between the Welsh and English syllabuses, the Welsh version will be prioritised.

12 Prizes - An Eisteddfod certificate and medal will be given to the first, second and third in every competition in the Urdd National Eisteddfod. In group competitions, one medal will be given, but more medals can be bought from the Eisteddfod Department.

13 Stage Size - The size of the National Eisteddfod stage is approximately 10m x 8m. The Local and Regional Eisteddfod stage sizes may differ, and any performance should be adapted to the space available.

14 Instruments - The Urdd will provide a set of Timpani drums and drum kit for the preliminary and stage of the Urdd National Eisteddfod only. Using your own drum kit is not permitted. However, this provision will not be available at the Local / Regional Eisteddfodau. You must use your own drums there.

Own Choice and Copyright

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure all appropriate permissions for the content of any own choice pieces within the performance.



- 4 Everyone who registers will be invited to compete in their local or regional Eisteddfod.
- 5 Some competitions will appear only in the National Eisteddfod and not in local and regional Eisteddfod. Details of these competitions are on the last page of the syllabus.
- 6 There are specific rules for each section in this syllabus. Stage and Maes.

Theatre Rules and Details

- 1 The General Rules in the front of the Syllabus are also relevant to this section.
- 2 The performance must commence with an empty performing area. It is not permitted to position any equipment before the competitors appear on stage. Likewise, it is not permitted to leave any equipment on stage at the end of the performance. A prop and set is defined as an item or equipment that one competitor can carry to/and from the stage.
- 3 The performance is timed from the first movement or the first sound until the company has left the stage.
- 4 There will be 5 microphones on the National Eisteddfod stage, and it will be possible to use up to 4 radio mics (except for the Duet/Ensemble from a Musical where up to 6 radio mics will be permitted).
- 5 It is not permitted for competitors to perform a piece they have already performed in the National Urdd Eisteddfod in the past three years.
- 6 It is permitted to include additional members for accompaniment only. The accompanists do not have to be within the competition age limit.
- 7 It is the competitor's responsibility to secure all appropriate permissions for the inclusion of any own-choice pieces, pre-recorded or live music which has been commercially published within the performance. Competitors are encouraged to use original music. For further details and guidance on how to secure performance consent see page 10.
- 8 Overuse of another language is not permitted.

Summary of Department's competitions

- 9 **Dialogue**
A presentation by 2-4 members of a set script or an own choice script based on the competition in question. The timing of any set script will be 5 minutes and it should be ensured that own choice scripts do not exceed 5 minutes. The instructors have the right to use two contrasting dialects. It is permitted to change the gender of characters if it makes sense and is in-keeping with the script. Simple costumes, props and set is permitted.
- 10 **Action Song**
A presentation of the theme and an emphasis on singing and acting is expected. The music should flow throughout the performance. The lyrics and melody can be either original, published or a combination of the two. If commercially published music is to be used, copyright clearance must be ensured. For further details and guidance on how to obtain permission to perform, go to page 10. Simple costumes, props and set is permitted.
- 11 **Dramatic Presentation**
A performance of a script on a set theme by a group. A presentation of the theme is expected with an emphasis on the dramatic element. It is permitted to use work such as parts of plays as well as original work. Background music is permitted to add to the atmosphere, but it should be emphasised that this is not the most important element of the competition. Simple costumes, props and set is permitted.

- 12 **Monologue and Individual Theatrical Presentation**
Presentation(s) of a published drama or prose or suitable original work. Only simple props are permitted for the performance.
- 13 **Solo from a Musical**
It is the responsibility of the soloist to secure performing copyright from the relevant publishing company. The contestants are expected to upload evidence of copyright/permission when registering to compete. For further details and guidance on how to obtain permission to perform, go to page 10.
- 14 **Duet/Ensemble from a Musical**
A performance of up to 5 minutes by 2 or up to 6 members from a song or scene of a Musical. Each member must represent an individual character during the presentation. Due to copyright reasons, it will be necessary to check with the publisher if using costumes and props that simulate stage Productions. Each competitor must provide their own accompaniment. Use of a band or pre-recorded music is allowed, but it is the responsibility of the group to ensure copyright. For further details and guidance on how to obtain permission to perform, go to page 10.
- 15 The following competitions will not appear on the Local and Regional Eisteddfod stage, but competitors must register before the 1st of March.
- 16 **Stand-up**
A presentation of original comedy work by an individual, no longer than 4 minutes. This competition will be held on Llwyfan y Maes, National Urdd Eisteddfod on the last Saturday afternoon. There is no need to present a script beforehand, but the content must be decent and not libellous.
- 17 **Extract from a Musical**
There is no need to present the whole story. Extracts of songs may be used but competitors should attempt to ensure that the presentation flows. Only simple costumes, props and set is permitted. A band or pre-recorded music may be used. It is the group's responsibility to ensure copyright clearance. For further details and guidance on how to obtain permission to perform go to page 10.

2 Competing - All pieces of work in the ADT Section must go through Local /Region rounds. First place from the Primary section, the first and second from the Secondary and Aelwydd section in each County/Region will go through to National adjudication.

a) ADT Medal: The ADT Medal is awarded to the competitor who has presented the most promising work from all the products of Yr.10 and under 19 who reach the National Judging round.

b) Young Artist Scholarship Yr.10 and under 25: All Young Artist scholarship competitors are invited to a special National judging round and omit to appear in a Circle/Region judging round.

3 Regional Round Date - The date for the regional adjudicating will be decided before the end of April. Contact your local Community Officer to confirm the date.

4 Registration - All competitors in the Art, Design and Technology section must register online by the date of the local or regional Adjudication: www.urdd.cymru/eisteddfod. After registering, an individual registration sheet must be printed for each competitor and attached to the back of the work.

5 Entries - All entries in this section must be work created by the member(s).

6 Competitors will not be allowed to compete more than once in each competition within this section.

7 Size - The size of each item:

- a) 2D Work:** No more than 760mm x 560mm
- a) 3D Work:** No more than 750mm x 750mm x 750mm
- a) Ceramics/pottery work:** No more than 400mm x 400mm x 400mm

8 3D Definition - An object that's visible from each direction and is self-supportive.

9 The weight of each item - 3D Work should not weigh more than 12kg except for entries in the Young Artist Scholarship Yr.10 and under 25 years old

10 Mounting - In order to protect the work, mounting on black paper or card is permitted. There are specific guidelines for the photography section. Using a 'window mount' or a frame for 2D work is not permitted, apart from where a frame is necessary for the work's structure. The winning entries will be professionally mounted for the exhibition.

11 Additional Learning Needs - Additional Learning Needs (ALN) are defined in line with the Local Education Authority's rules

12 Publishing - The Urdd has the right to use or publish images of entries in the Art, Design and Technology section in future without seeking the creator's permission for marketing and promotion purposes.

13 Loss or damage - Great care will be taken of the entries, but the Urdd will not be held responsible for any inevitable losses or damage that could happen when transporting the work to the national adjudication and to/from the Eisteddfod Maes. If entries are very valuable or fragile, competitors are welcome to make their own arrangements to transport the work.

Composing and Creating Rules and Details

1 The General Rules in the front of the Syllabus are also relevant to this section.

2 All entries of the Urdd Eisteddfod's literary and composing competitions are adjudicated at national level, apart from Art, Design and Technology competitions

3 Unless otherwise stated, the competitions are for individuals only.

4 All products in this section, apart from Art, Design and Technology competitions, must be uploaded when registering to compete by March 1, 2022.

5 The Urdd is entitled to publish all or some of the musical and literary compositions awarded winners and use them for the purposes of the Urdd in the future, without seeking the authors' consent or paying any other royalties or payment.

6 The Chair, The Crown, The Drama Medal, The Learners Medal, The Composers Medal may be won up to three times.

7 The work submitted must be the author's original work, which has not previously been published in any way, either in whole or in part.

8 The Urdd reserves the right to edit any work that is judged suitable for publication in the Cyfansoddiadau anthology.

9 Competitors are not allowed to compete more than once in all competitions within the department.

Method: Any illustration method may be used, but we recommend avoiding luminous paint, fragile collage or any medium that would not reproduce well.

Type: Any type should be black and on transparent overlay, not on the actual artwork.

Competitors should bear in mind that fragile work may be damaged. The Urdd will not be held responsible for any losses or damages to competitors' work.
