Code of Conduct



Urdd Gobaith Cymru

You are required to follow the guidelines below to ensure that the highest quality of Urdd provision is offered to all

- 1. The Welsh language **must** be encouraged at all events.
- 2. Everyone **must** be treated with respect.
- **3.** Children and young people **must** be given the opportunity to express their views and contribute to decisions.
- An example of good behaviour that you would like others to follow must be given.
- 5. Activities **must** be planned to ensure that more than one adult is present or that they can be seen or heard by others at least.
- A young person's right to personal privacy must be respected.
- 7. Separate sleeping arrangements **must** be in place for leaders and children and young people.
- 8. The safe use of social media **must** be ensured and encouraged when communicating with children and young people.
- **9.** Children and young people **must** be given the opportunity to discuss any issues that concern them.
- Children and young people must be encouraged to feel comfortable and confident enough to draw attention to attitudes or behaviour they don't like.
- Situations that may jeopardise your relationship with a young person must be avoided. As a worker / volunteer it is against the law for you to have a sexual relationship with a member who is under 18 years of age.
- **12.** It **must** be remembered that your actions may be misinterpreted by someone else, even if your intentions are good.
- The need for care and support at sensitive times must be recognised when discussing and advising on issues such as bullying, bereavement or abuse.
- 14. The principles and ethos of Urdd Gobaith Cymru **must** be implemented.

You are required to follow the guidelines below to ensure a high quality Urdd offer to all

- 1. Do not allow derogatory activities among members (e.g. admission rituals, other disparagement, bullying).
- 2. Do not be involved in physical games with children and young people.
- **3.** Do not have inappropriate physical or verbal contact with children and young people.
- **4. Do not** jump to conclusions about others without making sure of the facts.
- 5. Do not allow yourself to be drawn by inappropriate distractions such as a temper tantrum or a 'crush'.
- 6. Do not show favouritism towards any individual.
- 7. Do not make suggestive comments or signs in front of children and young people.
- 8. Do not let any disclosures or allegations of abuse go unrecorded or unreferred (see Urdd Gobaith Cymru's guidance on Safeguarding Children).
- 9. Do not believe "this can never happen to me".

Don't forget that support is available from the professional staff at Urdd Gobaith Cymru.

Staff registered with the EWC are also committed to following the EWC Code of Professional Practice.

You must behave in a professional manner bearing in mind that you represent the Urdd.
