## Urdd National Eisteddfod - General Rules

The rules stated below are relevant to every Eisteddfod - 'Cylch' (Local), 'Rhanbarth' (Regional) and 'Cenedlaethol' (National).

### What is an Eisteddfod?

The Urdd National Eisteddfod ('Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd'), one of Europe's largest youth touring festivals that attracts around 90,000 visitors each year, will once again be held during Whitsun week at the end of May. The Urdd Eisteddfod week is the pinnacle of around three years' hard work by local volunteers. It attracts a lot of attention from the press including TV, radio, the web and local and national newspapers.

The Eisteddfod is a competitive festival with over 15,000 children and young people under the age of 25 competing during the Eisteddfod week in various competitions such as singing, dancing and performing. They have been whittled down from around 40,000 competitors across Wales, having won their place following local ('Eisteddfod Gylch') and regional ('Eisteddfod Rhanbarth') rounds held in the spring months leading up to the Urdd National Eisteddfod ('Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd').

The three Pavilions, Coch, Gwyn & Gwyrdd (Red, White & Green, representing the Urdd colours) are the hub of the Eisteddfod. Surrounding these Pavilions on the 'Maes' are a myriad of colourful stalls offering a range of activities for all the family - from climbing and sport sessions to live bands, children's shows with some well-known TV characters and a fun fair. Also, the Arts Exhibition displays all the winners of the Art, Design & Technology competitions.

In 2026, the Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd (Urdd National Eisteddfod) will be held on Ynys Môn, and in 2027, the festival will visit Casnewydd, Gwent.

We hope to see you there!

### Eisteddfod yr Urdd Terminology

'Rhanbarth' (Regional) - County round (there are 18 Urdd Counties in Wales)

Organiser - Local Officer / Teacher / Volunteer

Group competitions - 5 members or more.

Person of care - Parents / Guardians / Branch leaders / Teachers / Instructors

### Compliance with the rules

**Urdd Gobaith Cymru expects all competitors, instructors / teachers and parents to commit to a spirit of fair play in all aspects of the Urdd's competitions and activities.**

### Official Names of Urdd Branches

1 Cangen Ysgol (School Branch) - All branches operating within a Primary, Secondary or Lifelong Learning School or College.

2 Adran/Aelwyd Branch - A Community branch of the Urdd, open to all members conducting meetings outside of school hours and organization with a program of activities throughout the year.

3 Performing / Specialist Branches- These Urdd branches are welcome to compete in the Eisteddfod in the relevant age categories, except for competitions restricted to Schools, 'Adran' or 'Aelwyd'. For further guidance, please contact the Eisteddfod Department, Glan-llyn.

4 Competing Outside Wales - Competitors who live beyond the Welsh border can compete in a designated Regional Eisteddfod. The normal registration procedure must be followed.

5 To be eligible to compete, all branches must register as an Urdd branch before their regional competition deadline. For more information, contact the [aelodaeth@urdd.org](mailto:aelodaeth@urdd.org)

### Urdd Eisteddfod Language Policy

1 Welsh is the language of the Eisteddfod.

2 Background Music - Where background music is permitted, any instrumental music or song in the Welsh language can be used, but you must seek permission from the copyright holders. See Own choice a Hawlfraint on page 11 for more information.

### Who can compete?

1 Members - You must be a member of Urdd Gobaith Cymru to register to compete in the Urdd Eisteddfod. Membership is arranged via our website: [urdd.cymru/membership](http://urdd.cymru/membership).

2 Accessibility - The Urdd Eisteddfod is committed to providing equal experience and opportunities and to make every reasonable effort to make the competing experience as enjoyable as possible for all.

3 Competition restrictions - All members of the Urdd are entitled to compete in the 'Eisteddfod Gylch' (Local Eisteddfod).

4 The Winner - The winner will represent the 'Rhanbarth' (Region) at the 'Genedlaethol' (Urdd National Eisteddfod). Where this is not possible, the Eisteddfod Department may invite the second at the 'Eisteddfod Rhanbarth' to take their place. The Eisteddfod Department can invite the second as well as the first to represent the 'Rhanbarth' at the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' (National). The relevant competitors will be notified shortly after the

last Eisteddfod 'Rhanbarth' has been held. In the Region where the Eisteddfod is held, the first and second of each competition will be invited to represent the 'Rhanbarth' at the 'Genedlaethol' (Urdd National Eisteddfod).

**5 Age for competing** - Competitors must be within the competition age on the 31 August after Eisteddfod Ynys Môn 2026. For example, for a '14 and under 25' competition applicants must have turned 14, but not have turned 25. The date of birth of each competitor is requested before the Urdd National Eisteddfod. If there is doubt about the age of any competitor, the Eisteddfod Organizers will have the right to ask to see the member's birth certificate.

## 6 Competing

i All members of the Urdd can compete in the area where they live, where they receive their full-time education, or with the branch where they practise (with regards to group competition).

ii All members competing in multiple individual competitions must do so in the same branch. It is not permitted to compete in more than one Local / Regional round in individual competitions.

iii All 19-25 years old duets, trios or quartets must compete where the majority of members live or receive their education. Where there is no majority, you must contact the Eisteddfod Department, Glan-llyn, for advice before registering. Members under the age of 19 must compete in a branch where they live, where they receive their full-time education, or with the branch where they practise with the group competition in question.

iv A member may belong to more than one branch - a School 'Adran' and an 'Aelwyd', for example. That member can compete for either branch in different competitions. However, they must choose to compete as an individual in one branch or the other, but in group competitions the member can associate themselves with the branch that taught the group in that specific competition

v Competitors are not permitted to compete for more than one branch in the same competition or belong to more than one group in the same competition.

**7 Individual Member** - Any Urdd Member is permitted to compete as an Individual Member if they are not affiliated to a branch in the Region where their home is, or where they receive their education.

**8 Number in School Branches** - In the competitions where the number of pupils in a school branch is limited, they should be counted from reception to Year 6 on 31 January (prior to the Eisteddfod). In Lifelong Learning schools, count all relevant pupils up to Year 6

**9 Competing as a Federation School** - Federation Schools are allowed to compete as a Federation or as Individual Schools - the same decision must be applied in every competition.

## General Rules for Welsh Learners (Dysgwyr Cymraeg)

**1** Members moving from Welsh Medium to English-medium education are allowed to compete as a learner in group competitions for learners only.

**Primary** - Learners are classified as members who have not followed or are not following a Welsh programme of study in the Foundation Phase and in Key Stage 2. If they are latecomers, moving from a non-Welsh medium school to a school where the majority of pupils study through the medium of Welsh, they are permitted to compete as learners for their first three years at the school.

**Secondary** - Learners are classified as members who have not followed or are not following a Welsh programme of study in the Foundation Phase and in Key Stage 2. If they are latecomers, moving from a non-Welsh medium school to a school where the majority of pupils study through the medium of Welsh, they are permitted to compete as learners for their first three years at the school.

**2 Authenticity** - When registering competitors, it is understood that branch leaders guarantee the authenticity of every competitor in the Welsh Learners' Section competitions

**3** The General rules of the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd' (Urdd National Eisteddfod), in addition to the competition rules set out in each section also apply to learners' competitions.

## How to compete?

**1** Register to compete - Everyone who wishes to compete must register on our website before the respective national deadlines. See Dyddiadau i'w cofio on page 13.

**2** Verifying Period - There will be a verifying period of three working days for members to check the information after the closing date. Guardians can check their children's competitions online, alerting the branch / school / Urdd of any problem.

**3** Late Registration - Once the verifying period has expired the system will close and it will not be possible to add competitors or modify information unless an administration fee is paid. Late registration can be made by paying the administration fee up to 48 hours before the first performance / Eisteddfod.

**4** Set pieces - Competitors must learn the set piece noted in the syllabus and be prepared to perform the whole work at each Eisteddfod stage. Copies of words and/or music are not permitted except in the instrumental competitions. Competitors must use the correct edition(s) and key(s) noted in the Syllabus. Some solo competitions offer a



choice of keys to suit the vocal range of competitors and these will be noted in the syllabus.

5 Eisteddfod Rhanbarth (Regional Eisteddfod) - Each competitor must appear on the stage at the 'Eisteddfod Rhanbarth' unless noted otherwise (page 89 and 90). No individual, party or choir may compete in the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd' (Urdd National), unless they have been officially sent there following the result at the 'Eisteddfod Rhanbarth'.

6 Consistency - All competitors must perform the same piece(s) throughout the Eisteddfod journey, from the 'Eisteddfod Gylch' (Local) to the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' (Urdd National). It is not permitted to change competitors between Eisteddfodau. Everyone in group competitions is encouraged to list reserves in order to avoid any issues that may arise.

7 No competitor is allowed to perform any piece they have already performed at the Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd in the last three years.

### Eisteddfod Rules

1 If a competitor breaks one of the General Rules or individual Subject Rules in the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' (National Eisteddfod), then they will not be awarded a prize.

2 Joint winners - Joint placings (first, second and third) will not be awarded in any Eisteddfod competition except when there are 4 in the competition, where equalling only 3rd place is allowed. If joint winners' names are sent to the Eisteddfod Department, neither competitor will be accepted. In the same manner, it is not possible to share prizes in the 'Composing and Creating' competitions.

3 Specific Time Rule - No performance may exceed the stated time specified in the Syllabus. If the competitor's performance exceeds the allotted time at the 'Eisteddfod Gylch' and/or Rhanbarth (Local and/or Regional) a note will be placed in the adjudication, and they will be verbally informed by the Eisteddfod Organizer. The performance must be modified by the next Eisteddfod. By the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' (Urdd National Eisteddfod), it is not permitted for any performance to be over the specified time limit - competitors exceeding time limits will not be awarded any prizes.

**Remember, tempos can change during a live performance on a large stage. When preparing a programme or track, make sure you have (at least) 10-30 seconds to spare at the end - just in case! Note: The Urdd Eisteddfod's official timings will be used to decide if a competitor has exceeded the permitted time.**

4 Before Competing - All competitors must be prepared to perform when called. If they do not register within half an hour of their allotted time, the Eisteddfod Department has the right to remove them from the competition.

5 Official Accompanists - Vocal soloists and duettists must use the Official Eisteddfod Accompanists. This does

not include instrumental soloists, the Solo 19-25 years old [see competition details], the Solo or the Duet / Ensemble from a Musical.

### Processes and Procedures

1 The Adjudicator's Decision - The adjudicators' decision in each case will be final within the rules and guidelines of the festival. Any appeal should be made in writing and brought to the attention of the Eisteddfod Organizers or Urdd Officers within 5 days following the conclusion of any competition. The matter may also be discussed verbally. Under exceptional circumstances, an Appeal Panel will be established. There must be robust reasons for establishing an Appeal Panel. Disagreeing with the adjudicator's opinion is not an adequate reason for complaint. The main adjudicator of each competition is the name that appears first in the programme. The decision of the Chair of the Eisteddfod and Arts Board and the Chair of the Urdd will be final on the competitive matters of all Urdd Gobaith Cymru Eisteddfodau.

2 Adjudication - A short adjudication will be available to all competitors after the competition has appeared on stage. A written adjudication cannot be guaranteed to competitors for composition work. A list of the winners will be published on our website and app, as well as a volume of winning literary compositions and an exhibition of the winners in the Art, Design and Technology Section. The adjudication will be provided in Welsh, but in some circumstances it will be possible to provide a translation which will be available after the Eisteddfod.

3 Staging Competitors - The winners in each 'Rhanbarth' (Region) will compete on one of the stages of the Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd (Urdd National Eisteddfod), be it a Pavilion, an external stage or competition venue.

4 Adjudicators and Accompanists - Adjudicators are not permitted to instruct or teach any competitor within the sections in which they are adjudicating or accompanying between the 1st September and the Eisteddfod. Accompanists (excluding Cerdd Dant) are not permitted to instruct or teach any competitor within the sections in which they are adjudicating or accompanying between the 1st September and the Eisteddfod. Adjudicators at the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' must not adjudicate in the Eisteddfodau 'Cylch' or 'Rhanbarth' in the same section in which they will adjudicate at the 'Genedlaethol'. The Director reserves the right to invite adjudicators at the last minute in order to complete adjudications at any/or all Urdd Eisteddfodau.

5 Postponing an Eisteddfod - The Urdd reserves the right to curtail, postpone or cancel any Urdd Eisteddfod if it is deemed necessary due to exceptional circumstances. The Urdd will endeavour to ensure that all Festival arrangements are efficient but shall not be held accountable for any loss that may occur during any Eisteddfod in the Urdd's name.

6 Staging a Competition - The Urdd reserves the right not to stage all competitions on the main stages of the

## 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd'.

**7 Public Performances** - When submitting a registration form, the person of care acknowledges that all the Urdd Eisteddfod activities are public and competitors will appear on stage in front of those who attend the event. The names of competitors and branches / schools will be announced from the stages in the Eisteddfod and will be published on the Urdd's internal administration documents. At the 'Genedlaethol' (Urdd National Eisteddfod), the names of competitors and branches will be shared with the press including television and radio companies. There is a possibility that the names and images of Urdd Eisteddfod competitors will appear publicly on the Urdd website (e.g. Eisteddfod results) and other public platforms including but not limited to newspapers, local papers, websites and on the Urdd and other social media accounts. The 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd' (Urdd National Eisteddfod) will be broadcasted live on TV and radio and extensively from the 'Maes' (see rule 9 below). It is the person of care's responsibility to notify the Urdd of any reason not to disclose information about any member. The Urdd is willing to comply, co-operate and facilitate the process to ensure that every member of the organization can compete in the Urdd Eisteddfod in accordance with the member's wishes.

**8 Copyright** - It is illegal to make additional copies of music, poetry, or any published work. Please see page 10 for further details and guidance on how to secure a publisher's permission to perform a piece of work in public. The competitor is responsible for securing the right to perform their 'own choice' piece(s) in public, and for ensuring that any translation is an official translation registered and approved by the publisher. Proof is requested that these rights have been granted. It is the responsibility of the broadcaster to secure the right to broadcast a piece of work. The Urdd can provide an example of a letter to be sent to the publishers with suitable wording, as well as contact details of the various publishers. Failure to secure the right to perform may mean that competitor(s) are not entitled to perform in public at an Eisteddfod. When using a copyright piece in an originally composed performance (e.g. Stand-up / Action Song etc), it is the competitor's responsibility to ensure all appropriate permissions to use the piece. Such permission must allow the Urdd, S4C and / or any third party with the publishers permission and/or PRS, to make the performance available without restrictions, globally, in all mediums or forms of distributions (which exist now or may be developed in the future). Copyright assistance is available by calling the Welsh Department, PRS for Music on 020 3741 4033 or emailing [welshstvprogrammes@prsformusic.com](mailto:welshstvprogrammes@prsformusic.com). There is no need to ensure permission to use set pieces in the Syllabus. We encourage everyone to choose songs that will not create any difficulty in terms of broadcasting. Some composers / groups should be avoided when it is not possible to secure copyright to broadcast the song. For further details and guidance on

how to ensure permission to perform, see page 10.

**9 Broadcasting** - When registering to compete or attend the Urdd Eisteddfod, the member or person of care acknowledges the possibility that their picture or performance will be recorded and broadcast. The Urdd will be entitled to use them for the Urdd's purposes in the future including broadcasting on S4C, online, on our social media and on BBC Radio Cymru, without seeking the individual's further permission or payment of any other royalties or payment.

**10 Publishing** - The Urdd reserves the right to publish all or some of the winning 'Composing and Creative' compositions to be used for Urdd purposes in future, without seeking further permission from authors or paying any royalties or any other payment.

**11 Changes to the Syllabus** - Any changes to the Syllabus will appear on the Urdd Eisteddfod website. If there are any differences between the Welsh and English syllabuses, the Welsh version will be prioritised.

**12 Prizes** - An Eisteddfod certificate and medal will be awarded to the first, second and third in every competition at the Urdd National Eisteddfod. In group competitions, one medal will be given, but more medals can be bought from the Eisteddfod Department

**13 Stage Measurements** - The size of stages at the 'Genedlaethol' (Urdd National Eisteddfod) are: 'Pafiliwn Coch' (Red) - 6m x 4m; 'Pafiliwn Gwyn' (White) - (10m x 8m); 'Pafiliwn Gwyrdd' (Green) - (10m x 8m). The size of the stage in the Eisteddfodau Cylch and Rhanbarth may differ, and performances should be adapted to fit the size of the stage available.

**14 Instruments** - You cannot use your own drum kit on the various stages of the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd' (National). A set of drums will be provided on all stages and 3 timpani for the orchestral competitions (only). Drum kits will not be provided at the 'Eisteddfod Gylch' or Rhanbarth' (Local / Regional) where you are required to bring your own kit. If you wish to use the timpani in the orchestral competitions, you must inform the Eisteddfod Department by the 1st of March.

**15 Eisteddfod Organisation** - The organising of the Regional Eisteddfod is the Regional Committee's responsibility. Similarly, the organisation of the Local Eisteddfod is deputised to the Local Committee. Urdd National Eisteddfod rules apply to all Local and Regional Eisteddfodau. If disagreements arise, the Local and Regional officers must consult with the Eisteddfod department before making any decisions.

**16 The use of a Digital Piano** of high quality is permitted if a suitable piano is not available. Each case is considered individually in cooperation with the local Music Service

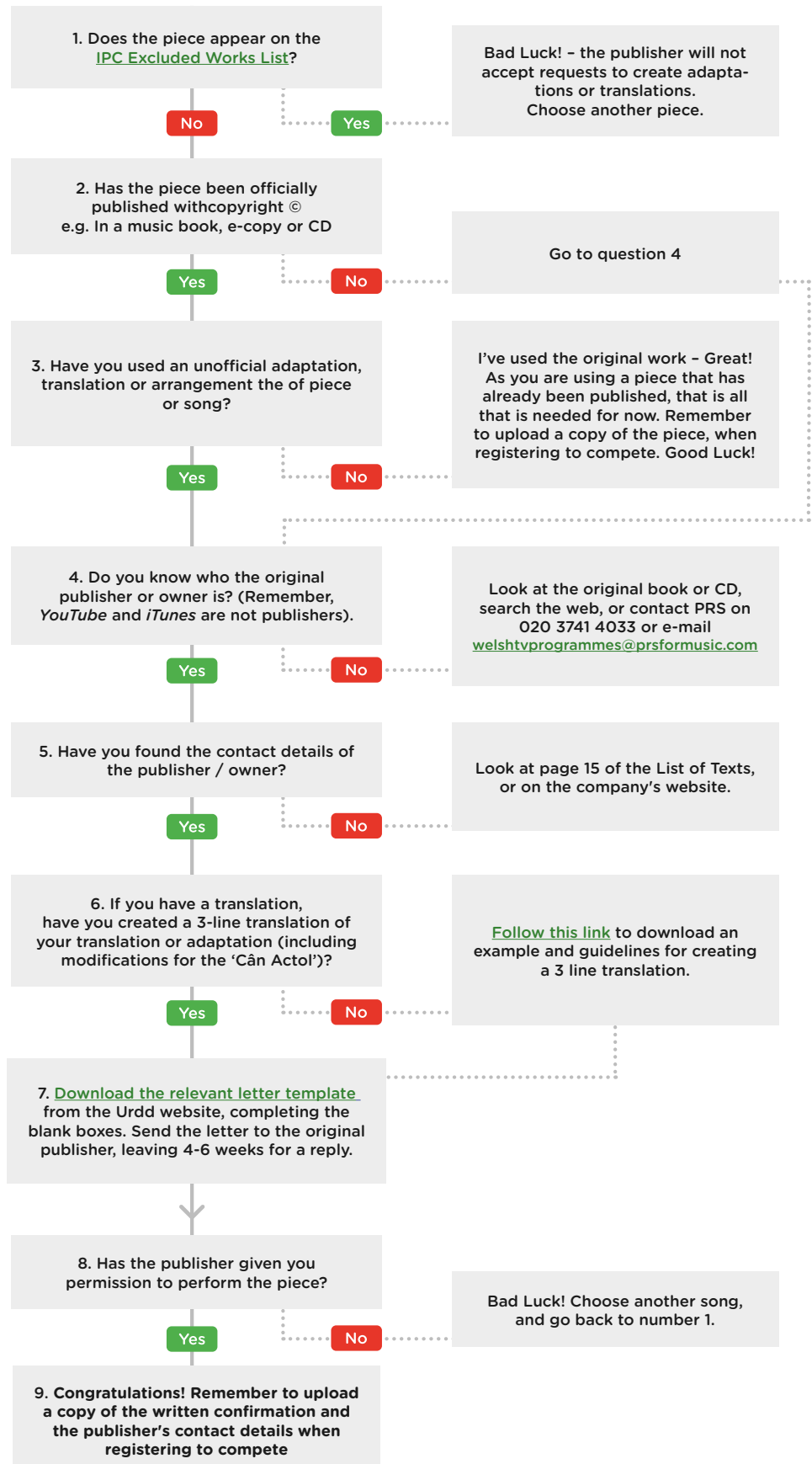

- 1 The General Rules at the beginning of the Syllabus are also relevant to this section.
- 2 Every competitor must perform the same instrumental piece(s) at every stage, from the 'Eisteddfod Gylch' (Local) to the 'Genedlaethol' (Urdd National Eisteddfod).
- 3 Competitors must not exceed the time limits of each competition and must time from the first note (of the soloist or accompanist) to the last note of the performance including any pauses between pieces. See Eisteddfod Rules (3), page 9.
- 4 All competitors must provide their own accompanist. Pre-recorded music whether on a track or on an electronic instrument is not permitted except for Solo Guitar and Percussion competitions, where instrumental or tracks in the Welsh Language are permitted. The track should not include the part performed by the competitor.
- 5 Solo guitarists and drummers are permitted to use a click track in the younger age groups (Primary / Yrs 7, 8 & 9) but competitors are encouraged to omit it if possible. The click track is not permitted in the older age groups (Yrs.10-13 and 19-25 yrs old). Competitors in the older categories are not allowed to use the practice tracks (Yrs. 10-13 and 19-25 yrs old).
- 6 Complete copies must be uploaded when registering to compete. A complete copy is one where all parts are under each other in a score and in one PDF file as opposed to a series of individual phone images.

**Percussion solo** - Drummers in the Percussion Solo may provide a detailed plan (on paper) which outlines the main characteristics of the performance from section to section, rather than providing a musical copy or a full score of the music.

**Ensemble / Band / Orchestra** - Each ensemble, band or orchestra must provide a full score of their music. A score includes the part of each instrument set underneath each other - not a set of individual copies for each instrument.

- 7 It is the competitor's responsibility to secure the copyright of any music played live or on a track, which has been published commercially. For further details and guidance on how to secure the right to perform, see Own choice and Copyright on page 11.

- 8 **Drums** - The Urdd will provide a drum kit on each of the stages of the Urdd National Eisteddfod. You cannot use your own drum kit. However, this provision will not be available at the 'Eisteddfod Gylch' / 'Rhanbarth' (Local / Regional).

**Timpani** - The Urdd will provide 3 timpani for the orchestral competitions. If you wish to use the timpani, you must register an interest by March 2nd - we cannot ensure the availability of the instruments at the Eisteddfod if you miss this deadline.

**Piano** - One piano only is provided in each pavilion, on stage right. The piano must stay in it's allocated position(s).

- 2 A guide on how to arrange the music for competitions in this section, is available on the Cymdeithas Cerdd Dant Cymru website. [www.cerdd-dant.org](http://www.cerdd-dant.org)
- 3 The arrangement of each air noted in the Syllabus should be adhered to. An instrumental and/or vocal arrangement may be added to the air, but no instrument apart from the official harp(s) shall be used to play the full arrangement.
- 4 All competitors in the Cerdd Dant section must use the official harpists on stage at the 'Cylch', 'Rhanbarth' and 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' (Local, Regional and National Eisteddfodau), (see exception in competitions 86, 87, 88, 89, 98, 99, 100 and 101. Every effort should be made to ensure the service of a harpist for these Eisteddfodau, but if a difficulty arises using a piano will be allowed. It must be ensured that all competitors performs under the same conditions in all cases. i.e. one official accompanist for the competition as noted above.
- 5 In competitions 86, 87, 88, 89, 98, 99, 100 and 101, two harps must be used on stage at the 'Cylch', 'Rhanbarth' and 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol'. The second harp can either be the competitor's choice and under 30 years old or the official second harpist whose name is opposite the competition. The use of an additional harpist to the two already mentioned is considered part of an ensemble and they must, like any other musician used, be under 30 years old. The number noted in a group refers to the number who sing.

- 4 Competitors must use the version noted in the Syllabus.
- 5 In addition to the main melody, it is permitted to use any traditional Welsh melodies, or original melodies that are traditional in ethos/mood (unless otherwise stated) which are suitable as an accompaniment. All Folk Dances should start and end with the original melody, unless otherwise stated. A list of these tunes must be submitted 10 days before the first performance.
- 6 If no specific number of dancers is noted, it is permitted to use any number of dancers appropriate to the requirements of the dance.
- 7 Parties and solo dancers are expected to make every effort to ensure live accompaniment for their dances, but it is permitted to use pre-recorded music where this is not possible, unless otherwise stated. If two parties are deemed to be equal in dancing, then the nature of the accompaniment will be taken into consideration. Changing the key is permitted.
- 8 It is the competitor's responsibility to secure the copyright of any pre-recorded music or live music they use, which has been published commercially. For further details and guidance with regards securing permission to perform a work under copyright, see Own choice and Copyright on page 11.
- 9 Parties are permitted to use up to three accompanists over 25 years old among their accompanists.
- 10 The costumes, including shoes, are expected to add to the atmosphere and entirety of the presentation.
- 11 When forming a dance group, relevant guidelines of the specific dance should be adhered to.

- 3 Instructors are not permitted to place the dancers (or any small props) in their positions at the beginning of the performance at any Urdd Eisteddfod.
- 4 Using instrumental or Welsh Language music is permitted. It is the competitor's responsibility to secure the copyright of any pre-recorded music or live music they use, which has been published commercially. For further details and guidance with regards securing permission to perform a work under copyright, see page 11.
- 5 The dancers must wear suitable and appropriate clothes for the dance and age group.
- 6 The performance area on the National Eisteddfod stage is approximately 10 x 8 metres.

**Creative** – Competitors are not permitted to use stage equipment, props and special lighting, make up, body accessories or any other equipment – except in the Creative Dance Group competition for Schools/Units with Additional Learning Needs. Competitors are expected to present a brief synopsis in Welsh of no more than 100 words, explaining the content of the dance for the benefit of the adjudicators and the audience. Timing will begin from the first movement therefore dancers should refrain from moving during the reading of the synopsis.

**Multi-Media Dance** – A creative interpretation of the theme using contrasting styles. At least two

- contrasting styles must be performed. Suitable costumes and props may be used to interpret the theme which are small/light enough for individuals to carry on stage. The competitors will be expected to provide a short synopsis, no more than 100 words, explaining the content of the dance in Welsh, for the adjudicators and the audience. The synopsis will not be timed. The timing will start from the first movement. At least 3 styles must be performed.
- 7 It is not permitted to compete in more than one competition with the same dance.
  - 8 Every movement must be inkeeping with the theme and style of the dance and the choreography must concentrate on the specific steps within the dance.
  - 9 It is essential that the training the dancers receive considers aspects of health and safety rules. Performers must ensure that they warm up before performing and cool down at the end of the performance.
  - 10 Competitors must upload their synopsis for creative and multimedia dance when registering to compete on Y Porth before the closing date.
  - 11 Competitors must provide their backing tracks in MP3 or WAV format and a hard copy on CD or USB in case. The track length should not exceed the timing noted. Competitors must upload their track to Y Porth when registering to compete before the closing date.
  - 12 The use of props is not permitted.

It is the competitor's responsibility to secure the copyright of any pre-recorded music or live music they use, which has been published commercially. - 4 Overuse of another language is not permitted.
- 5 In the recitation competitions, where the set piece is written in a specific dialect, small changes to specific words to make the piece sound natural in the competitor's dialect will not be punished. However, you should ensure that any changes are concise and do not affect the rhythm, rhyme or change the meaning of the set piece in any way, staying true to the poet/author's work.
- 6 The number noted in a group refers to the number reciting. Additional members are permitted for instrumental accompaniment only. In the competitions for Secondary Schools and Aelwydydd, everyone appearing in the competition must be within the appropriate age group. In the competitions designated for Adrannau (except for School Adrannau) or for members of primary school age, one accompanist is permitted to be over the competition age limit.
- 7 Competitors must use the version noted in this Syllabus. It is not permitted to use a different edition in any competition unless otherwise stated.
- 8 The performance must commence and end with an empty playing area. It is not permitted to position any equipment, set or props before the competitors appear on stage and it is not permitted to leave any equipment on stage at the end of the performance.

- 2 The performance must commence with an empty performing area. It is not permitted to position any equipment before the competitors appear on stage. Likewise, it is not permitted to leave any equipment on stage at the end of the performance. A prop and set is defined as an item or equipment that one competitor can carry to/and from the stage.
- 3 The performance is timed from the first movement or the first sound until the company has left the stage, except for solo and ensemble from a musical competitions where the timing is from the first until last note.
- 4 There will be 5 microphones on the National Eisteddfod stage, and it will be possible to use up to 4 radio mics (except for the Ensemble of a Song from a Musical, and Extract from a Musical Yrs.7 and under 25 years old where up to 6 radio mics will be permitted).
- 5 It is not permitted for competitors to perform a piece they have already performed at the 'Eisteddfod Genedlaethol' (National Urdd Eisteddfod) in the past three years.
- 6 It is permitted to include additional members for accompaniment only. The accompanists do not have to be within the competition age limit.
- 7 It is the competitor's responsibility to secure all appropriate permissions for the inclusion of any own-choice pieces, pre-recorded or live music which has been commercially published within the performance. Competitors are encouraged to use original music. For further details and guidance on how to secure performance consent see Own choice and Copyright on page 11.
- 8 Overuse of another language is not permitted.
- 9 **Performance of a Scene 2-4 members**  
Presentation by 2-4 members of a set script or own choice script depending on the competition under consideration. The performance length of the own choice script should be no more than 5 minutes. Competitors are permitted to change and modify the accent, and gender of the character if it makes sense and is compatible with the script. Costumes, props and a simple set are permitted.
- 10 **Cŵn Actol - Yr.6 and under** A presentation of the theme with the emphasis on singing and acting is expected. The music should flow through the performance. Words and melodies can be original, published or a combination of both. Competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music. Costumes, props and a simple set are permitted.
- 11 **Group Dramatic Performance Yrs. 6 and under**  
Performance of a script on a set theme by a group. A presentation of the theme with the emphasis on the dramatic element is expected. Competitors may use work such as excerpts of dramas as well as original work. The use of background music is permitted to add to the atmosphere, but it should not be the most important element of the competition. Singing is not allowed in this competition. Costumes, props and a simple set are permitted. Competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music.
- 12 **Performance of a Scene Yrs.7, 8 and 9**  
Duration - 5 minutes. Between 5-10 members. Competitors must choose a scene / event from one of the set novels. All the content for the performance must derive from the novel. You can present the scene using any theatrical technique / style. The competition doesn't require performing the story as a whole. e.g. You can share the narrative between the whole group, use a chorus, tableaux, movements, puppets etc. Anything that will create an entertaining performance for the audience. Props and costumes are permitted. Competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music.
- 13 **Group Dramatic Performance Yrs.7, 8, and 9 and Yr.10 and under 19** Duration - between 5-10 minutes. No fewer than 10 members. A

theatrical interpretation of one of the stimuli. The performance can be all music, all theatrical, or a combination of both. The performance may include entirely original material or material from other authors or composers. Props and costumes are permitted. Competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music.

**14 Performance of a Song from a Musical**

Competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music by the relevant publishing company. Competitors must upload evidence of the copyright / permission on registration.

**15 Monologue** Presentation(s) of a drama, excerpt of published prose or original work. Props and costumes are permitted.

**16 Ensemble of a Song from a Musical** Performance of up to 5 minutes, by 2–6 members, of a song or scene from a musical. All members must represent an individual character during the performance. Due to copyright reasons, competitors will be required to check with the publishers if they can to use costumes and equipment that replicates stage productions. Competitors must provide their own accompanist, which may be live or prerecorded. Competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music by the relevant publishing company.

**17 Stand-up** A performance of original comedy by an individual, no longer than 4 minutes. The competition will be held on one of the Eisteddfod's outdoor stages. There is no need to submit a script in advance but the content must be suitable and not libellous.

**18 Extract from a Musical** The story does not have to be presented in full, and competitors may sing parts of songs, but should try to ensure that the presentation flows to create a whole. Props, costumes and a simple set are permitted. A band or pre-recorded music can be used but competitors must ensure copyright if using commercially published music by the relevant publishing company. For more of details and guidance on how to secure copyright / performance permission see Own choice and Copyright on page 11.

**19 Codi Hwyl** – Any script performed must be original. It is the responsibility of the competitor(s) to arrange permission regarding copyright for any music used. Up to 8 minutes of performance. 5 minutes is allowed to set up and clear the stage. Individual or group (up to 12 in number) Depending on the number of competitors, it may not be possible for every applicant to perform at the Urdd National Eisteddfod, so each applicant will be required to provide a video clip (no more than 4 minutes long) or a written document by March 2 outlining the content of the performance, number of performers, and any staging requirements. The Eisteddfod Department will then contact the winning competitors to invite them to compete at the Urdd National Eisteddfod.

- 2 The final will take place during The Urdd National Eisteddfod week at a location on the maes.

#### Competition rules

- 1 The General Rules at the beginning of the Syllabus are also relevant to this section.
- 2 It is the responsibility of the competitor to prepare equipment and their own model to complete the task in every round.
- 3 There will be one electrical socket for each competitor in every round.
- 4 There will be a table and chair assigned to each competitor in every round.

#### Hairdressing Level 1 / Entry

Create a complete image based on the theme. Every competitor will have 90 minutes to complete the task including setting up and clearing up. The make-up, costume and accessory work may be completed beforehand by the competitor only. The competitors are free to choose their equipment and products for the task. It is permitted to prepare 30% of the hair/hair accessories beforehand.

#### Beauty Level 1 / Entry

Nail art and make-up based on the theme. 90 minutes to complete the task including setting up and clearing up. The competitors should concentrate on the final look, but the adjudicators will also consider the hair and costumes. The hair and costumes may be prepared in advance.

- 2 **Competing** - All entries in the ADT Section must go through the 'Cylch' / 'Rhanbarth' (Local / Regional) rounds. The winners of each Primary competition, the winners of the first and second prizes from the Secondary and Aelwydydd competitions in each 'Rhanbarth' (Region) will go through to the National adjudication.
  - a **ADT Medal** The ADT Medal is awarded to the competitor who has presented the most promising work from all the Yr.10 and under 19 entries reaching the National Judging round.
  - b **Ysgoloriaeth Artist Ifanc / Young Artist Scholarship Yr.10 and under 25** All Young Artist scholarship competitors will be invited to a special National judging round and will not appear in earlier Eisteddfod judging rounds.
  - c **Entries** All work submitted must be original work created by the contestant(s), with the official Urdd CDT registration label attached, which includes a signature of an adult (over the age of 18) to testify that this is the case.
- 3 **Regional Round Date** - The date for the regional adjudication will be decided before the end of April. Contact your local Community Officer to confirm the date.
- 4 **Registration** - Register by 20th April 2026. Each piece of work will need to be labelled, using the label provided at registration.
- 5 **Sum** - Competitors will not be allowed to compete more than once in each competition within this section, apart from the Illustrations for a Story-picture book on page <?>.
- 6 **Size** - The size of each item:
  - a 2D Work: No more than 760mm x 560mm
  - b 3D Work: No more than 750mm x 750mm x 750mm
  - c Ceramics/pottery work: No more than 400mm x 400mm x 400mm
- 7 **3D Definition** - An object that is visible from each direction (except the bottom if standing on the ground) and sustains itself.

**2D Definition** - Thin/flat work suitable to hang on a wall

- 8 **Photography** - The same photograph is not allowed to be submitted in more than one

competition. It is not possible to include a photograph from an individual competition in a series of picture competitions. It is not permitted to use the same photo in the colour photograph competitions and the black and white photograph competitions.

- 9 **Weight** - 3D Work should not weigh more than 12kg except for entries in the 'Ysgoloriaeth Artist Ifanc' / Young Artist Scholarship Yr.10 and under 25 years old.
- 10 **Mounting** - In order to protect the work, mounting on black paper or card is permitted. There are specific guidelines for the photography section. Using a 'window mount' or a frame for 2D work is not permitted, apart from where a frame is necessary for the work's structure. The winning entries will be professionally mounted for the exhibition.
- 11 **Additional Learning Needs** - Additional Learning Needs (ALN) are defined in line with the Local Education Authority's rules
- 12 **Publishing** - The Urdd, for marketing and promotional purposes, has the right to use or publish images of entries in the Art, Design and Technology section in future without seeking the creator's permission.
- 13 **Loss or damage** - Great care will be taken of the entries, but the Urdd will not be held responsible for any inevitable losses or damage that could happen when transporting the work to the national adjudication and to/from the Eisteddfod Maes. If entries are very valuable or fragile, competitors are welcome to make their own arrangements to transport the work.
