The Caravan and Camping Site - Rules and Conditions

Please read the Rules and Conditions carefully before submitting your application.



Making and application

1. All bookings must be completed online.
2. Payment - Payment in full must accompany this application.
3. If you would like a pitch next to a friend/group – choose a common name and enter it on the form under ‘Contact Name for Group Request’. It must be ensured that that everyone who wants to be near each other uses the same name in this section e.g. everyone in the group will need to enter ‘Mr Urdd’ in the box. There is no guarantee that your pitch will be close to your friend/group if the name is different.
4. You will receive an automated e-mail acknowledging your application along with a reference number. You will receive a pack including your pitch number and vehicle pass at the beginning of May 2024.
5. 3 nights is the minimum number of nights bookable.
6. You must contact Gethinpage@urdd.org immediately if you want to change your order. It will not be possible to change your order after May 1st, 2024, and the difference in cost will not be refunded.
7. If any of these Rules and Conditions is breached, the Urdd reserves the right to ask the occupiers to leave the site immediately and without warning. If this happens, no fees or parts of fees will be refunded.

Setting up your caravan/tent

8. The Caravan and Camping Site will be open from **12.00pm on 24 May 2024** and access will not be permitted before this time.
9. All vehicles must leave the site by **12.00pm on 2 June 2024**
10. The site will be available from midday on the first day of your stay. You will need to leave the site by midday on your final day.
11. It is not permissible to set up a caravan or tent before 9am and after 9pm.

Health and Safety

12. All caravans must have a ‘dry powder’ fire extinguisher which has been maintained and is in good working order and contains at least 900 grams of powder. A fire blanket must be available for use in the caravan’s cooking area.
13. Facilities for emptying chemical toilets and foul water will be provided on the caravan site. Foul water from the caravan must be kept in appropriate containers and taken from the caravan to be disposed of in the appropriate area.
14. All occupants are expected to keep the Caravan and Camping site in a clean and tidy manner, and to dispose of bin bags in the appropriate area of the site.
15. It is not permitted to wash oneself at the water standpipes, and elsan buckets must be rinsed at the appropriate taps. Care must be taken to ensure that all taps have been turned off before leaving.

Parking and Vehicles

16. Only one car per caravan is allowed on the caravan site. A fee of £20.00 will be levied for each extra car.
17. One car is permitted to park adjacent to the caravan. If you have a second vehicle, it must be parked in the designated parking area near the entrance to the Caravan and Camping site.
18. Cars are not permitted in the camping area. You must park your vehicle in the designated area and carry any equipment and tent on foot to your pitch.
19. It is not permitted for anyone to sleep in a car overnight.
20. Permits will be given to vehicles to indicate that they have permission to be on the caravan site. The permit must be clearly displayed inside the windscreen of the car. Vehicles without the necessary permit will not be allowed on the caravan site.
21. The caravan should be parked according to the instruction of the steward. A peg will indicate the pitch number.

22. Vehicles on the caravan site are limited to a maximum speed of 5 mph.
23. Vehicles and caravans are allowed access on condition that the Urdd will not be held responsible for damage or loss to:
 - Any caravan, tent, vehicle, or property.
 - Anything on, inside or in the vicinity of a vehicle, tent, or caravan, however it may have happened.
 - Any injury to a person.

General Rules

24. **Dogs are not permitted on the Caravan and Camping site, apart from guide dogs and support dogs.**
25. Motor homes and Campervans are permitted on the Caravan site however Trailer Tents will be in the designated camping area.
26. Any noise after 11pm will not be allowed.
27. The countryside code must be respected. Visitors must ensure any footpaths are kept to, and gates closed after being opened.
28. The behaviour and safety of any children under the age of 18 is the responsibility of their parents.
29. The electricity supply is limited to 10amps, and if you overload the system, the supply will 'trip' automatically. The switch can be reset, but if this happens regularly, the supply may be permanently disconnected. In this case no refund will be made.
30. Due to low overhead electrical wires, kites and banners are not permitted on the Caravan and Camping Site.
31. Chinese Lanterns are not permitted.

Open Fires and Barbeques on the Caravan Site

32. Open fires are not permitted.
33. An area will be designated for barbeques which will be in a safe location on open ground, away from caravans, tents, outdoor furniture, vehicles, awnings and any other structures.
34. It is permissible to light and use barbeque equipment (gas or charcoal) on condition that the following safety guidelines are adhered to.
 - The manufacturer's instructions should be read carefully and strictly followed before lighting, and only the recommended fuel should be used. Petrol should never be used under any circumstances
 - The barbecue area should be kept clear of other items that could easily burn and aid the spread of fire.
 - Never leave a barbecue unattended especially when there are children around.
 - When using gas barbecues, ensure that the hoses are in good condition and that the connections are secure to the gas bottle and cooking equipment. Gas bottles should never be placed near to heat.
 - A fire blanket and extinguisher should be kept on hand to deal with an out-of-control barbecue.
 - Barbecues should be cold before disposing of burnt charcoals. A disposal point for charcoal and disposable barbecues will be available on the caravan site
 - Never cook a barbecue under the influence of alcohol.
 - Never, on any account, should a barbecue be moved into an awning to 'keep people warm'.
